Tessellation Quilt by Rashida Coleman – Hale

QUILT SIZE: 66" x 77"

BLOCK SIZE: 11" x 11" Finished

MATERIALS	YARDS	CUTTING
12 Tsuru Prints	1/2 yd of 11 prints Fat quarter of 1 print	2 - 12"x12" square of each 1 - 12"x12" square
Linen (background)	3 1/2 yd	24 - 12"x12" squares 24 - 6"x6" squares
Backing	4 1/2 yd	two panels 77"x42"
Bindng	5/8 yd	8 strips 2 1/4" x 43"

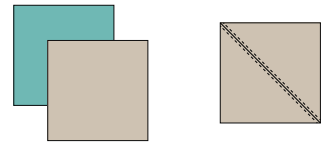

ASSEMBLY

- ① Layer on 12" x 12" linen square and one 12" x 12" print square with right sides together. Using a ruler draw a line with a pencil from one corner to the other. Stitch along both sides of the pencil line using a 1/4" seam allowance. (Fig. 1)

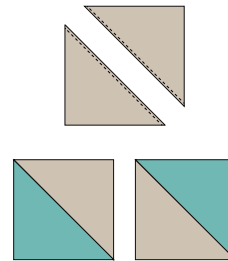

- ② Cut down the center of the pencil line with scissors or a rotary cutter, creating two units measuring 12" x 12". Press the seams open. Square up both units down to 11 1/2" using a ruler and a rotary cutter. (Fig. 3)

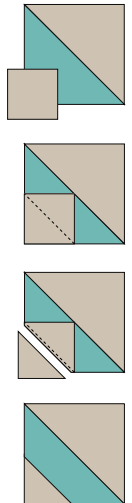
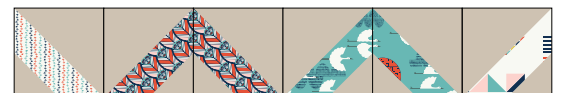
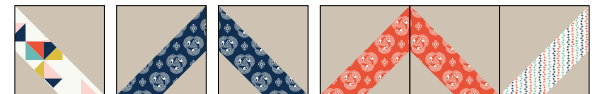
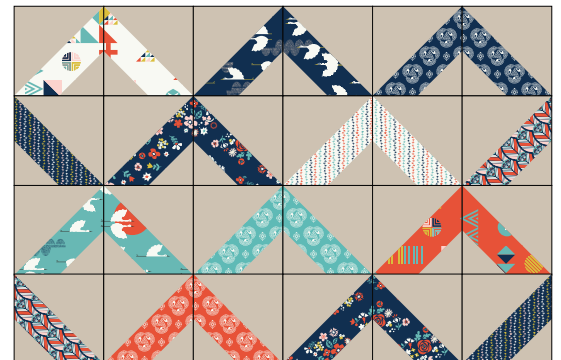

- ③ Place one of the units in front of you right side up. Layer a 6" x 6" linen square on top of the non-linen corner lining up the raw edges. Stitch from one corner to the other. Trim using a 1/4" seam allowance and press the corner back. Press the seams open. You've made your first block! (Fig. 3)



- ④ Make 42 blocks total. Using the Quilt Assembly Diagram as a guide, arrange the blocks as shown. Join the blocks in rows. Join the rows to create the quilt top.

- ⑤ Layer the quilt back, batting, and the quilt top. Baste the layers together. Quilt as desired, removing the basting as you go. Bind to finish!
